Dr. Frances L. Willoughby is the first woman doctor in the regular U.S. Navy

October 16, 1916

Margaret Sanger opens the U.S.'s first birth control clinic in Brooklyn, New Yotk

October 28, 1958

Mary Roebling is the first woman director of a stock exchange (American Stock Exchange)
