This month we honor the life and legacy of **Martin Luther King**, Jr. He was



born January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia, and was assassinated April 4, 1968. He was a Baptist Minister, civil rights activist and was a champion of human rights, justice and equality. His words still inspire, teach and shape individuals in the US and around the world.

In the 1960's, Martin Luther King, Jr. led the struggle against racial discrimination; inspiring his supporters with the power of his rhetoric. He advocated the principle of non-violent protest, affirming that opposition should be dealth with compassion and not with aggression.

He was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his commitment to non-violent struggle in 1964.


