



#### Florence Nightingale (May 12, 1820-August 13, 1910)



Florence Nightingale was an English social reformer, statistician, and founder of modern nursing. Nightingale came to prominence while serving as a manager and trainer of nurses during the Crimean War, in which she organized care for wounded soldiers at Constantinople. She significantly reduced death rates by improving hygiene and living standards. Nightingale gave nursing a favorable reputation and became an icon especially in the persona of "The Lady with the Lamp" making rounds of wounded soldiers at night.

#### Mother's Day (Sunday, May 11th)

Mother's Day is celebrated on the second Sunday in May. It is a day to honor mothers, motherhood and maternal bonds in general, as well as their positive contributions to their families and society. It was established by Anna Jarvis, with the first Mother's Day celebrated with a service of worship held in West Virginia on May 10, 1908.



#### Sally Ride Day (May 26)



May 26 is Sally Ride Day to honor the first American female astronaut to go into space. It is meant to be a day to learn about science and promote space exploration. The date commemorates Sally Ride's birthday and it has been observed yearly since 2003. Sally Ride is a role model for girls who are interested in space and science. In 2001, she started her company to create educational programs, Sally Ride Science helps to




