Palm Desert, CA – The Trendsetter Chapter of the American Business Women's Association (ABWA) is offering two scholarships worth \$1,000 each, funded through the Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund (SBMEF) to two deserving area student(s).

Each year, local leagues of ABWA provide Stephen Bufton Memorial Scholarships (SBMEF) to female students who will be attending accredited U.S. colleges, universities or community, vocational, technical schools.

Applicants must be citizens of the United States; residents of the Coachella Valley or Imperial County; CA; entering (high school graduating seniors, college freshman, sophomore, etc.) in August 2025 and attending College of the Desert or an accredited Community College, Vocational or Technical School in the Coachella Valley or Imperial County, CA, with a GPA of (2.5-4.0) or higher.

Applications must be completed by May 15, 2025, at *www.sbmef.org*. A minimum of three (3) eligible completed applications are required in order for the scholarship to be awarded. Recipient(s) will be notified in *July 2025*.

SBMEF, ABWA's national educational fund, is one of the most highly respected grant and scholarship funds in the country. For over 70 years, ABWA has helped women achieve their business and professional success through educational scholarships. Since its inception, more than 17,000 women nationwide have been awarded more than 17 million dollars in scholarships.

The Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund is a 501 (c) 3 charitable trust and public foundation. It has the same tax status as public schools, churches and community funds. The fund is listed in the U.S. Internal Revenue Service "Cumulative List of Organizations" described in Section 170(c) of the IRS code of 1954 – revised Oct. 31, 1974.


